

First stop however, was a mountain bike competition. Afterwards, the kittens were taken to the VCFJ Law Firm where staff and visitors were more than happy to provide loving care and attention.

The case wrapped up with a VCFJ Law Firm staff member adopting one of the kittens. Another baby, aptly named Bill, for billable hours, became the new office kitty. And efforts continue to secure mom and have her spayed. All of the kittens will be ready for adoption soon thanks to the Barbi Feldman family and everyone at VCFJ Attorneys at Law.

### FL SARC Top Notch

Our new disaster response training program and team, FL SARC, has made tremendous strides since we took over the 10-year-old 501(c)(3) at the end of 2021.



Since the new year, we have trained over 150 new volunteers in countless cities in Florida including Lakeland, Tallahassee, Naples, Jacksonville, and even Pensacola. FL SARC has quickly become the top training program for animal disaster response in our state. We have also deployed within our state to assist with cruelty and hoarding cases.

The program recently caught the attention of those involved in national disaster response, and those working in other states. FL SARC won a bid against competing state programs to fly to Virginia to train their disaster response team in August. FL SARC's response team was also called to deploy to New Mexico over the last month by ASPCA, to assist with animals impacted by wildfires.



ASPCA stated, "Because of the amazing response we did not need to utilize other partners. Your entire organization is so top notch, and we are so lucky to be partnered with SPCA of Florida."

June is National Foster a Pet Month and we're celebrating with a Foster Open House.


Come to SPCA Florida on Saturday, June 25th, noon to 3 PM. There will be information on becoming a foster parent, crafts, games, and light refreshments.
